Dear Commissioner Troast,

We are pleased to announce that on Thursday, January 10, 2012, the Court ruled in favor of the City of Miramar and Sun Bergeron in the lawsuit brought by Wheelabrator Technologies, Inc., a Waste Management Company.

On July 3, 2012, the City of Miramar entered into a contract with Sun Bergeron for Solid Waste Disposal Services. The contract was the result of a competitive procurement where an evaluation committee, comprised of representatives from Miramar, Oakland Park, Davie, Coconut Creek, and Hallandale Beach, ranked Sun Bergeron as the best offeror, taking into account its Qualifications, Technical Proposal, and Cost. Wheelabrator immediately filed its lawsuit against the City and Sun Bergeron. Following a five-day trial in Broward County, Circuit Court, the Court rejected the claims raised by Wheelabrator.

This is a great win for the citizens of Miramar and all residents of Broward County. The

Court upheld Miramar's right to make decisions that are clearly in its best interest and in the best interest of its residents. The ruling affirms Miramar's historic decision, breaking up a 25-year solid waste disposal monopoly in order to provide more competition. The results of that decision speak for themselves, prices have been brought down by more than 50%, and there is a renewed focus on recycling that will greatly improve sustainability and promote good environmental stewardship. Sun Bergeron is ready to carry out its commitment to the residents of Miramar. Its contract with the City provides value added environmental stewardship and sustainability.

From the outset, as recognized by the Court, the Miramar competitive contract was intended to serve as a vehicle for other municipalities to piggyback on for their solid waste disposal services. With the Court's rejection of Wheelabrator's complaint, we look forward to having other municipalities participate in this historic opportunity to ensure competition in this marketplace.

Sun Bergeron thanks you for your consideration, and looks forward to presenting another opportunity to serve your solid waste disposal needs.
